When Utah Clean Energy was incorporated in 2002, wind and solar farms in the state were nonexistent, next to zero homes had solar, and talking about climate change in the halls of Utah's state capital required walking a political tightrope. In the years since, Utah Clean Energy has transformed Utah's energy landscape. Utah now has enough renewable energy to power approximately 700,000 Utah homes, energy efficiency is a priority energy resource, and Utah leaders from across party lines are discussing the risks and solutions of climate change. With this transformation, Utah Clean Energy has become recognized as the state's foremost expert on climate, clean energy, and air quality solutions.

Read on for the top 20 wins that you helped make possible!



1 Renewable energy in Utah goes from zero to 2000+ megawatts

Following key wins in the utility-regulatory arena where Utah Clean Energy ensured renewable energy developers got a fair price for their projects, Utah was finally able to capitalize on our amazing renewable energy resources with industry investing \$2 billion in new utility-scale projects. Utah now has enough solar, wind, and geothermal projects to power 645,000 Utah homes. And this is just the beginning! Utah's renewable energy is set to more than double in the next five years.



3 2,100,000 tons of CO₂ prevented through energy efficiency since 2010

Utah Clean Energy was instrumental in making energy efficiency a priority energy resource in Utah, and worked with regulators and local utilities to shape the Rocky Mountain Power Wattsmart and Dominion Energy ThermWise programs, resulting in approximately \$1 billion dollars of investments in energy efficiency rebates and incentives for Utah homes and businesses over the last decade.

2 Keeping new coal resources out of Utah

What was likely going to be an automatic assignment of additional shares of coal plants to Utah's Rocky Mountain Power customers was halted when Utah Clean Energy's experts partnered with other Utah stakeholders in a sweeping, multi-state utility case. We played an active role in stopping efforts to redistribute unwanted coal from other states to Utah without asking whether this redistribution would serve Utah's public interest. This process is ongoing and Utah Clean Energy remains front-and-center to prevent further attempts to saddle Utah with unwanted coal resources.

Working on Utah's first climate mitigation plan

We were honored to be asked by then-Governor Jon Huntsman to serve on his "Blue Ribbon Advisory Council on Climate Change." This group of scientists and industry experts found that Utah was responsible for more greenhouse gas emissions per capita than the rest of the nation. At a time when few Utah leaders publicly acknowledged the threat of climate change, the group broke new ground by outlining 70 actionable steps Utah could take to turn the tide on climate change.



5 Creating Utah's first Energy Efficiency Strategy

Energy efficiency was for too long the unsung hero of a healthy climate! With our partners at the Southwest Energy Efficiency Project, we developed a comprehensive strategy for Utah to achieve robust energy and emission savings through energy efficiency alone.



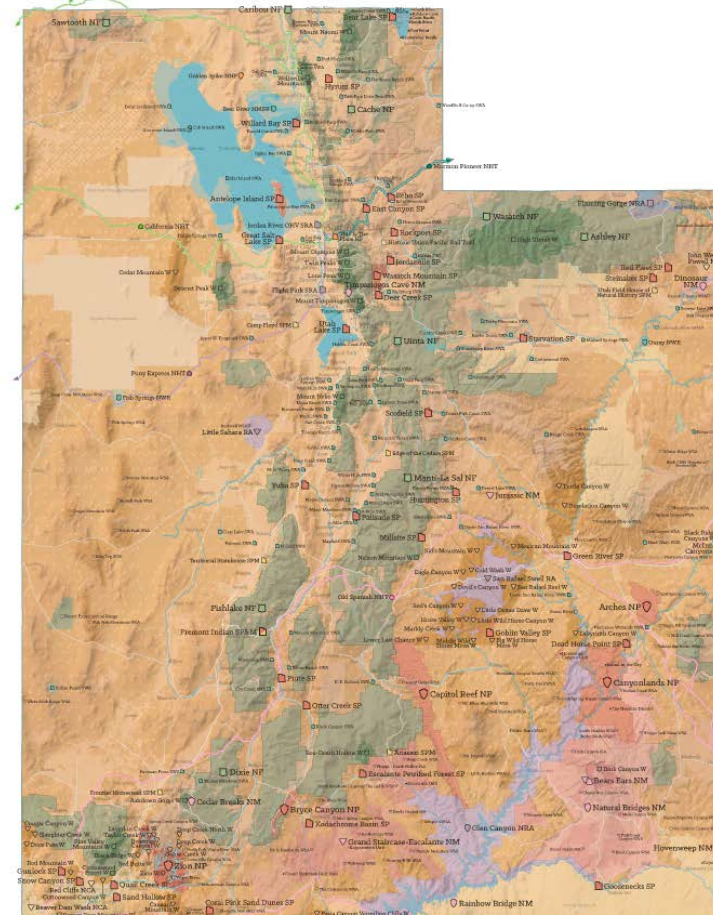

Rooftop solar energy doubles year-after-year

Pro-solar policies passed by Utah Clean Energy created a solar renaissance in Utah! Utah went from an “F” to “A” grade in a national solar report card after we streamlined interconnection and improved “net-metering” to give solar owners a one-to-one credit on their electricity bill for the solar they sent to the grid. This made going solar easier and more economical for Utah families, which resulted in rooftop solar in Utah DOUBLING every year between 2007 – 2016. As of March 31, 2021, nearly 50,000 homes and businesses are powered with rooftop solar.

7 A historic investment in electric vehicle charging in Utah

Utah Clean Energy worked with Rocky Mountain Power and a variety of stakeholders to advance the “Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Program” to dramatically expand access to electric vehicle charging across Utah. The program’s \$50 million investment will not only double the amount of charging stations in Utah but will expand access to EV charging to Utahns living in apartments, helping more people make the switch to clean transportation.

Over 1,000 Utah homes go solar through Community Solar

We jump-started rooftop solar through five different Community Solar initiatives that made going solar simple and streamlined! We utilized the power of bulk purchase to reduce costs, and our experts provided would-be solar owners with information on the dos and don'ts of going solar. Our Community Solar initiatives ultimately helped over 1,000 Utah homes go solar.



9 Unifying communities during Utah Climate Week

Through the Utah Climate Action Network initiative, each year we support dozens of organizations, businesses, and local governments to host climate week events across Utah all dedicated to learning about and taking action on climate.



10 Salt Palace installs the largest rooftop solar project in the West (at the time)

Following our success on two major policy and regulatory changes to allow rooftop solar projects up to 2MW and Power Purchase Agreements (PPAs) for local governments and nonprofits, we helped make then-Mayor Peter Corroon's dream come true when the Salt Palace installed what was at the time, the largest rooftop solar project in the West!



11 Utah becomes trailblazer among conservative states

The launch of Utah's Climate & Clean Air Compact was a pinnacle achievement in creating bipartisan support for climate and clean air solutions. Utah Clean Energy worked with a Steering Committee of Utah leaders to contact, educate, and ultimately engage over 175 Utah voices on the need to address climate change. The Utah Climate & Clean Air Compact represents Utah's most diverse group of state and local governments, faith communities, businesses, healthcare, and Utah's congressional delegates calling for climate solutions.

Launch of the Clean Energy Business Coalition

Utah Clean Energy launched the Clean Energy Business Coalition, a diverse, powerful community dedicated to powering our future with clean energy. Members of the Clean Energy Business Coalition support Utah Clean Energy's work and engage with us on game-changing policies that accelerate the adoption of renewable energy, energy efficiency, and zero emission transportation across the West.

Building the clean energy workforce

We teamed up with Salt Lake Community College (SLCC) to help design and launch their Energy Management Program, Utah's premier education program for the clean energy workforce. Through SLCC's Energy Institute, hundreds of students have completed training programs earning either a degree or certificate in specialized fields that are making our homes and buildings energy efficient, bringing clean solar energy to our lives, and accelerating the transition to a clean energy future.



14 Utah led the nation in electric vehicle adoption

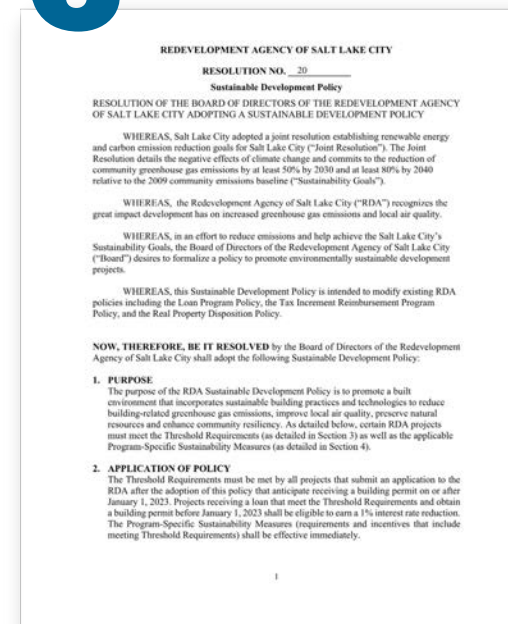
In 2016, Utah was the fastest growing electric vehicle (EV) state in the nation, thanks in part to Utah Clean Energy's work on EV tax credits, EV charging infrastructure, and an EV community purchase program also headed by Utah Clean Energy. We built on this momentum with Utah's first EV charging plan, paving the way for what is now over 865 public charging stations, and almost 24,000 EV drivers across the state.

15 Expanding access to energy efficiency in Salt Lake City's underserved communities

Not everyone can access energy efficiency tools due to up-front cost, limited promotion, or language barriers. We partnered with Salt Lake City to launch Empower SLC, dedicated to addressing those challenges by bringing energy saving tools, education, and resources to more Salt Lake City families. Since Empower SLC launched, we have empowered hundreds of residents on Salt Lake City's west side with energy saving tools and resources! We estimate that collectively, participants of Empower SLC are saving nearly \$200,000 every year, and preventing over 1,200 tons of CO₂ a year.

Redevelopment Agency of Salt Lake City commits to high-performance building

New buildings funded by the Redevelopment Agency of Salt Lake City (RDA) will now be ultra-energy efficient and fossil-fuel-free thanks to a new Sustainable Development Policy developed by Utah Clean Energy. Our team collaborated with RDA to develop a policy that not only utilized the best practices in high-performance, energy efficient building, but also a plan that is available for replication across Utah and the country.

17 Helping local governments achieve their clean energy and climate goals

Dozens of Utah communities have committed to ambitious renewable energy and carbon reduction goals. We teamed up with national experts, the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) and Rocky Mountain Institute, and Salt Lake City to analyze the challenges and created a roadmap for these and other communities to overcome the technical hurdles involved in reaching their ground-breaking renewable and carbon reduction energy goals.



18 It all begins: We officially incorporate in 2002

Our founder and Executive Director, Sarah Wright, had a vision for clean, healthy communities empowered and sustained by clean energy! Utah Clean Energy has grown from our humble beginnings as an all-volunteer organization to a staff fourteen-strong, recognized as Utah's foremost experts in win-win clean air and climate solutions.

19 Building affordable homes for a healthy climate

Utah Clean Energy partnered with Habitat for Humanity of Summit and Wasatch Counties to help two of their newest homes in Summit County achieve the U.S. Department of Energy's "Zero Energy Ready Home" certification. This educational pilot project sets the stage for more Habitat homes. We hosted custom training for Utah homebuilders to learn how to make more homes across Utah become ultra-energy efficient, benefiting Utah families for decades to come.

Coal plant retirements and Utah's largest commitment to clean energy

Through Rocky Mountain Power's highly complex "Integrated Resource Plan" our experts intervened in a regulatory proceeding that resulted in the early retirement of four coal units across the Utility's service territory. In the same utility proceeding, the utility committed to its largest investment in new renewable energy in its history, totaling 7,000 MW of new renewable energy across the West. This will prevent nearly 14 million tons of greenhouse gas pollution every year, equivalent to the emissions from the electricity use of over 2 million Utah households.

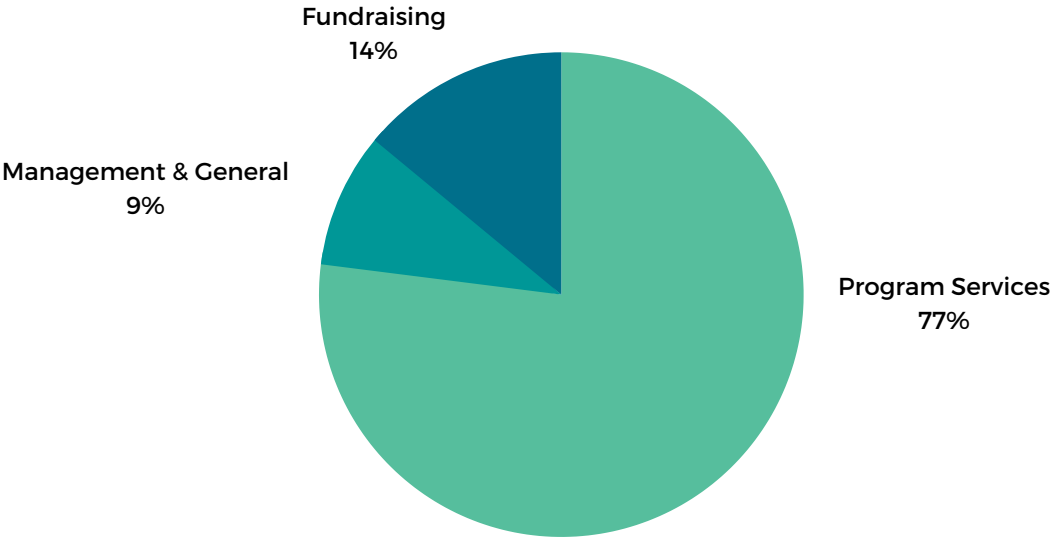

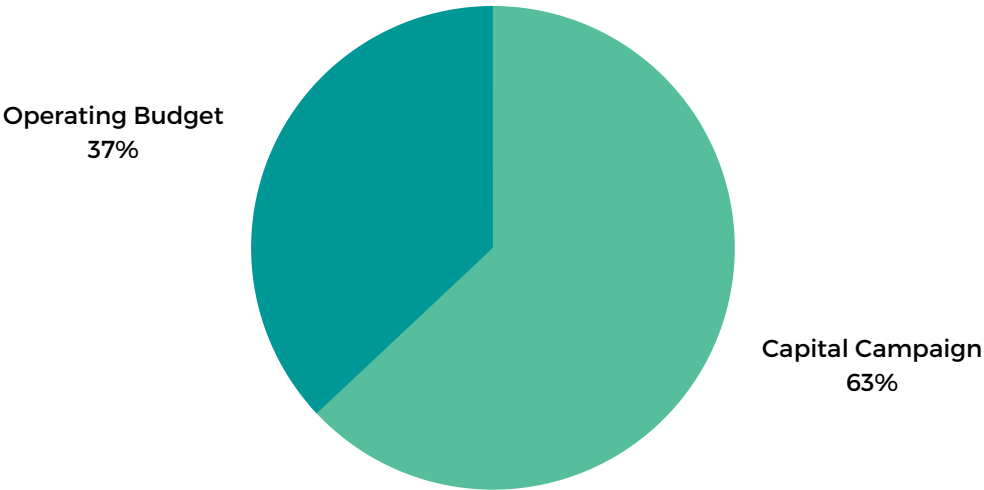
